

A fierce new musical unearths the forgotten female gladiators of Ancient Rome

CF Creative Productions presents

GLADIATRIX

An original musical debuting at this year's Edinburgh Festival Fringe, GLADIATRIX tells the story of female gladiators in ancient Rome through powerful songs and hard-hitting stage combat.

In 200 AD, Emperor Septimius Severus decreed that women could no longer compete in the Gladiator Games. Though at their worst, the games were home to *Ludi meridiani* (public executions) for many women, the arena was a place to exist outside of typical gender norms. What happens when an empire mandates how women use their bodies? Inspired by true events, this electrifying production explores the strength, sacrifice and resilience of the women history left behind.

Book writer and lyricist Paul Bianchi was drawn to the unsung history of female gladiators while researching for his mythology podcast, **Mythunderstood**. In only a couple of words, Ancient Roman historian Cassio Dio recalled the Emperor's inciting decree, women were "henceforth forbidden." Bianchi was intrigued and resolved to tell the story as a stage musical- a departure from the male gaze sword-and-sandal films where one would previously find a gladiatrix.

Bianchi teamed with choreographer Kirsten Longmuir to craft a unique balance of stage fighting and rhythmic movement. Musical directors Tony Gonzalez and Sam Johnides injected dark intensity into the songs. As the show developed, politics around the world vibrated against the themes of the show. While executive orders threaten to erase the existence of marginalised people, a meme has become popular about how often men think about the Roman Empire.

"As long as we're thinking about the Roman Empire," jokes Bianchi, "We might as well learn from it."

Gladiatrix is interested in shedding light on an untold story and holding up a critical mirror to our world today. It doesn't resurrect its characters as heroes or revolutionaries, but as women who lived in contradiction - choosing combat in a society that offered them little else.

Previous work by Bianchi includes satirical musicals *Ctrl Alt-Right Delete*, *Future Dystopia*, and viral successes *Deadpool Musical 1 & 2*. Johnides and Gonzalez have musically directed for *Bachelor The Musical*, *The Real Housewives Musical*, and *Supportive White Parents*. *Gladiatrix* is their first collaborative effort.

An original musical unearths the forgotten women of Ancient Rome Where history wrote silence, they sing.

Making its world premiere at the 2025 Edinburgh Festival Fringe, *GLADIATRIX* brings a rarely told chapter of ancient history to vivid life — the stories of the female gladiators who once fought for survival, spectacle, and something resembling freedom. Set against the brutality of Rome's arenas and the backdrop of imperial politics, this new musical confronts the state's power over women's bodies — in the past, and in haunting echoes of today.

In 200 AD, Emperor Septimius Severus issued a decree: women were "henceforth forbidden" from the gladiator games. With those two words, an entire population of female fighters was struck from history — their stories left to fade into myth. *GLADIATRIX* doesn't resurrect them as heroes or revolutionaries, but as women who lived in contradiction — choosing combat in a society that offered them little else.

Book writer and lyricist Paul Bianchi (Mythunderstood podcast) was captivated by the mystery of these erased figures. Drawing from his background in stage combat and a passion for ancient myth, Bianchi has teamed up with choreographer Kirsten Longmuir and musical directors Tony Gonzalez and Sam Johnides to create a bold and visceral work that blends classical themes with contemporary resonance.

Through evocative music, dynamic movement, and unflinching storytelling, *GLADIATRIX* explores who gets remembered, who gets erased — and how the state decides what women can and cannot do with their bodies. It's not a call to arms. It's a call to look closer.

That spark ignited a bold theatrical vision blending Bianchi's stage combat background with the dynamic choreography of Kirsten Longmuir and the rich musical direction of Tony Gonzalez and Sam Johnides. As the show developed, its themes of autonomy, identity, and rebellion gained urgent relevance amid today's global political landscape.
